Matthew Colden:

Thank you for your letter of April 30, 2026, requesting that the Amisk Hydroelectric Project (the project) be withdrawn from the impact assessment process. This letter provides you with notification that I have terminated the impact assessment for the project in accordance with section 73 of the *Impact Assessment Act* (IAA).

A notice informing the public that the impact assessment for the project is terminated will be posted on the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry (Reference Number: 80112). The Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (IAAC) will also notify the provincial government, federal authorities, and relevant Indigenous groups of the termination.

Since the project is a designated project as described in the *Physical Activities Regulations*, the prohibitions under section 7 of the IAA apply to the project. If you decide to move forward with the project in the future, you will have to submit an Initial Project Description to IAAC in accordance with section 10 of the IAA.
