**Subject: Notice of Comment Period on the Draft Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines and Draft Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan and Request for Input by January 28, 2020**

Thank you for your continued participation in the planning phase of the federal impact assessment for the Marten Falls Community Access Road Project (the Project).

The objective of this letter is to:

- inform you that the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) is conducting a public comment period from December 19, 2019, to January 28, 2020;
- invite input from your community on the draft Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines for the Project (Enclosure 1);
- invite input from your community on the draft Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan to guide consultation planning for the federal impact assessment (Enclosure 2);
- invite your community to identify any aspects of the environmental, health, social, and economic conditions that are of value to your community, and any existing studies or plans that could inform the assessment of the Project (Enclosures 3.1 and 3.2);
- provide responses to comments your community has provided to the Agency to-date (Enclosure 4)

### **Development of Impact Assessment Planning Documents**

On December 2, 2019, Mishkeegogamang Ojibway Nation received notice from the Agency that a federal impact assessment is required for the Project. During the week of November 25, 2019, the Agency met with several Indigenous groups to develop the draft versions of the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines and Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan. Drafts of the following documents are posted on the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry Internet site (the Registry):

- Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines (Enclosure 1)
- Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan (Enclosure 2)
- Public Participation Plan
- Permitting Plan
- Cooperation Plan

Your community is now invited to provide comments to enable the Agency to finalize the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines and the Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan to help define the scope, content and conduct of the federal impact assessment.

### **Comment Opportunity and Collaborative Development of Documents**

Drafts of the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines and Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan are enclosed with this letter for your review and consideration (Enclosures 1 and 2). The Agency is conducting a 40-day public comment period from December 19, 2019, to January 28, 2020, to seek input from potentially impacted Indigenous groups.

In order to facilitate the collection of comments within your community, the Agency has prepared two forms, which are attached to this letter.

1. The worksheet (Enclosure 3.1) is designed to help community members identify any aspects of the environmental, health, social and economic conditions that are important to your community (valued components); who uses these valued components; and how these components may be changed due to the Project.

Comments would be used to inform the finalization of the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines, which provide direction to Marten Falls First Nation, on the factors to be considered, the methodology to be followed and information requirements, in order to guide preparation of the Impact Statement.

The Agency also welcomes receiving information on any existing study or plan prepared by an Indigenous group that is relevant to the region within which the Project is proposed. Obtaining this information early in the planning phase will help inform the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines.

2. The comment form (Enclosure 3.2) is designed to help you provide input on how your community would like to be consulted during the impact assessment process. The comment form will be used to inform the finalization of the Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan as well as a community-specific consultation work plan, should it be requested.

Please note that you may submit comments in the format of your choice. The Agency requests that comments be submitted using the “submit a comment” feature available on the Registry (Reference No. 80184 at <https://iaac-aeic.gc.ca/050/evaluations/proj/80184>). Attachments can also be uploaded using this feature. Please note that any information submitted to the Agency to inform this project assessment will be made publicly available as part of the project file, and may be posted online via the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry (Reference #80184) subject to certain exceptions related to privacy, security or confidentiality. The Agency’s Submission Policy (<https://iaac-aeic.gc.ca/050/evaluations/participation/conditions>) determines which submitted information can be shared publicly, and what should remain private. Pursuant to the *Information and Management of Time Limits Regulations*, the Agency is required to post finalized versions of each of these plans by February 24, 2020. **Your input is therefore requested by January 28, 2020.**

During this comment period, the Agency will also seek input from the public on the Public Participation Plan, will seek input from federal authorities on the Permitting Plan, and will work with the Province of Ontario on the Cooperation Plan. The draft of each of the documents can be found on the Registry at <https://iaac-aeic.gc.ca/050/evaluations/proj/80184>.

**Invitation to participate in a Teleconference with the Agency**

To answer any questions you may have about the above-noted impact assessment documents and to discuss consultation planning specific to Mishkeegogamang Ojibway Nation, I propose a teleconference during the week of

**January 6, 2020.** I will be following up with your community in the coming weeks to confirm whether you are interested in a teleconference and to schedule a date and time.

**Participant Funding Program Grants**

Mishkeegogamang Ojibway Nation is now eligible to receive a second grant of \$5,000.00 to support your continued participation in the planning phase of the federal impact assessment, including your review and comment on the draft documents noted above.

The Agency's Funding Program Officer will be in touch with you shortly to confirm your interest in receiving this grant, and to outline the eligible costs and activities. Following the planning phase, the Agency will offer additional funding, through a contribution agreement, to support the participation of Mishkeegogamang Ojibway Nation throughout the subsequent phases of the federal impact assessment process.
