



Planning Phase Guidance Questions

Mont Sorcier Mining Project

The Joint Assessment Committee (the Committee), comprised of representatives from the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada and the Cree Nation Government, has begun the planning phase of the federal impact assessment process for the Mont Sorcier Mining Project proposed by the mining company Voyager Metals Inc.

The Committee is gathering input to identify concerns from communities that may be affected by the Project, to support the decision on whether to proceed with an impact assessment and to develop the public participation plan.

The following questions may help you provide the Committee with feedback:

1. What is your interest in the Mont Sorcier Mining Project?
2. What impact, positive or negative, do you think the Mont Sorcier Mining Project might have on you as an individual?
3. What impact, positive or negative, do you think the Mont Sorcier Mining Project might have on your community?
4. What specific knowledge (historical, environmental, social, economic, etc.) would you like to share that would be relevant to the assessment of the Mont Sorcier Mining Project?
5. What positive or negative environmental, health, social and economic impacts could result from the Mont Sorcier Mining Project that are of concern to you?
6. What other issues related to the assessment of the Mont Sorcier Mining Project are important to you and that you would like to make known?
7. There are many ways for the public to participate in the various consultation opportunities throughout the impact assessment process. What would be your preferred way of participating (e.g., in person or online, orally or in writing)?
8. What difficulties or challenges might prevent you or people in your community from participating in the public consultation process for the Mont Sorcier Mining Project (e.g., language, locations for in-person consultations, access to technology to participate in online consultations, economics such as childcare or travel costs)?
