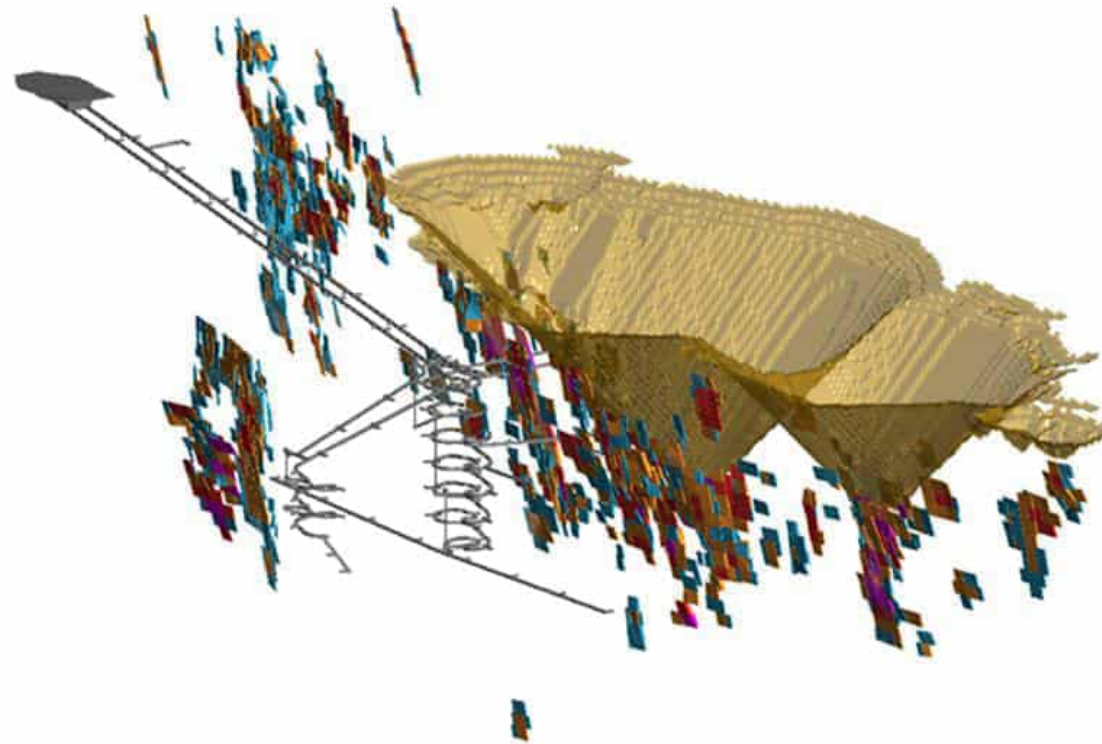

 - Extract a bulk sample of up to 60,000 tonnes by underground mining methods
- Extracted material will be transported up an underground ramp to surface by truck for crushing, sorting, sampling and stored in stockpiles. Samples will be transported by truck to test facility off site
- Testing provides a better understanding of grade and metallurgical recoveries to support a viable commercial production scenario

■: Will there be any further contaminants from milling getting into these ponds or being treated?

- AM: This is just groundwater and surface water. There is no milling involved at this point in the site plan so there won't be large amounts of contaminants.

■: Will there be a mill on site later?

- AM: At this point the AEX will be stand alone, we must first re-examine our milling strategy and once we have this plan finalized, we will know more accurately what our tailings will be along with the storage pond size and water treatment specifics. The Water treatment plan will most likely look different specifically from a sizing perspective.

■: Any phosphates or nitrates to worry about it in the effluent?

- AM: No, but if we do throw a camp in here this might be a concern due to sewage, this is not a part of the plan currently. However, as it currently stands, we are not planning on pumping any of this into the main pond, just the one to be treated. We are currently using tanks for sewage that is pumped by a contract company, so this is not a concern now.

Q: Will this change anything regarding the detectability of effluent?

- AM: It is still undetectable at 30m away.

Q: So, this is for the exploration, will the pipe be expanded for the main project?

- AM: It is being worked on as we need to figure out water storage, retention, and what we are treating for so this will change, and we are currently doing baseline work on the Chukuni which will feed into a more detailed plan.

Q: Do we have a ballpark on what will be discharged in the future regarding the main project? As it's currently around 2.5m a minute discharged?

- AM: Depends on our storage, and a few other factors now.

Q: Previous logging practices in the 80s have had a detrimental impact on fish, this is why folks are concerned, these areas were destroyed. Right now, there might not be much concern but if this discharge is ramped up, people will be concerned and want to see what could happen.

- AM: I understand this, we don't want a mishap at this happening, there is a separate issue for the past as industry and policy has changed. Most of the time industry will go above and beyond what government requires as we understand the mistrust of industry from the past. We are starting from scratch; this is why we have these meetings.

Q: This has the potential to be big, there's going to be a lot of work and money coming to this community. This should be done right.

- AM: The historic workings in this area didn't have these management plans and regulations, people are now understanding that if this isn't done right it will cost more later. The more we can hear comments, the more we can improve for the community.

█: I guess leading up to this. My primary concern is the final production and what's happening and how this will affect us, along with the █ family trapline which is extremely important. We really do want to be part of the process to be considered regarding being stakeholders.

- MP: Building on what Ashley said, we want to make sure we separate the two streams of AEX and the main Project. A lot of these concerns need to be answered as a part of the Project. We are looking at alternatives for tailings, technologies, this is an open pit and different from what has been done historically here. Looking at the end-product, having a strong understanding on the taking, quality, and volume, and how this interacts with the environments is very critical specifically when it comes to stakeholders. This group and the trapline holders are key stakeholders and are part of the path forward. Looking at 2024 and 2025, finding pieces where we can align and have these events, you are a part of this project. This dynamic and input from you, the public and the indigenous communities are shaping a better project. These comments do get reflected in the impact statement.

█: When I read the documents on the government website, we were not listed as stakeholders, but we feel it is important as the mine's going to go, and we can be overlooked.

- MP: From our team, this wasn't an overlooking in a sense, but the promise to this group going forward this is key in shaping the process. Going forward, the process is ensured that you have the avenues to ask questions through us or the agency. Information sharing back and forth can be challenging, but if you have these questions, please provide these to us on the team. Things like creating a model for the site, videos to explain or other concerns or focus. Water is a huge part of our project as we have downstream users, and it's a way of life here in the North. We have a lot of information, and we are only getting more to shape this project.

█: Bottom line is if all the shiners get destroyed, or if anything else happens to the fish, then what?

- MP: Under a compliance basis, this is legally enforceable under the IAA. We will have compliance and operation concerns which have a series of fines as well as other punishments. We must explore the worst-case scenario as part of the process.
- AP: Majority/all the compliances we get from approvals will require and environmental emergency response, we will strategize on the ERP and figure this out. If we have certain quantities of substances on site we must report worst case scenarios, we will want our accountability. These discussions and input will be had.
- MP: We want to be able to plan around things and ensure public participation. We are still working around details such as Indigenous portions of participation. Things like fisheries compensation and closure will be explored by way of a workshop.

Q: Is there a reason why more claims were bought?

- AM: Yes, the mine should own the land, so we did purchase this.

Q: About the project, will this be fenced in, so hunters won't get in?

- AM: This is a hot topic as we have forestry developing, and other uses in the area. There hasn't been a strategy for fencing, Tuzyks road being owned by us is in consideration. Wildlife is also a concern, but this is one thing being discussed from a safety standpoint.

Q: People will be hunting from the west side. Safety does need to be there.

- A: As we have drills, we put a general plan for restricting this in the area and people understood this.

Q: A hunter came in previously with logging, people are curious and want to see. If they see tracks, they will want to be hunting.

- AM: Setting up the no hunting signs last year; we had further safety in both the area and for our employees. More signage and releases will be done.

Q: Are these areas in the Baseline Spotlight – Aquatics the furthest south we are monitoring?

- AM: Yes, as this is further south on the Chukuni (Pakwash).

Q: Pakwash is a spawning area for shiners, why is this not being monitored?

- AM: We should already capture the area for aquatics since we are surveying further upstream, water quality is surveyed in the Pakwash.

Q: The impact is going to increase closer to the original source and then decline, is the assumption? And this will be picked up on the last station?

- AM: No this is for aquatics, not water quality, benthics would be better for assessment of water quality. The benthics in this location have a baseline, but if this changes downstream, we have one upwards, one down at the reception, and one where the impact will end.

Q: There is an assumption that the downstream monitoring point will be where the impacts will end.

- AM: Yes, as this is past the area.

Q: Earlier it was told that you don't know the final discharge volume, how do you know this will be where it ends?

- AM: This is for aquatic for the main project, this is deemed to be acceptable for experts. This is not regarding water quality. We don't see how going into Pakwash would be beneficial, as there are other inflows to Pakwash. We are measuring the stream we are putting our effluent in. We will look at the flow, we can discuss this with our consultants.

Q: We don't think that this is a big ask and speaks to the history. No one sees the impact from previous projects. The trout diminished from an issue at a mine which closed 40 years ago, and it is currently getting back up. We don't want to get back into this but the upstream downstream does weird things.

- AM: The hydrometric will be done in the Dixie; a lot of people just look at the downstream, but we have identified this as what is needed. We are studying

the 2022 floods and using this to guide us. There will be better models than what went on back in the day, the Pakwash could be studied, and we can bring this up.

Q: Camp owners and other users are concerned about the fish.

- A: We will ensure concerns are addressed, and even those not present in the winter. For flow, our last monitoring station is at the mouth of Pakwash, there is lots of work going on here to monitor flow.

Q: How do these monitoring stations reach back with information?

- AM: Currently, we have the water logger for the flow level, and we do in field velocity measurements. AEX will be temporary for more infrastructure which will provide more information.

Q: The week to week and a half where this isn't looked at could cause issues.

- AM: This is for baseline as it stands, monitoring will be better as the project moves forward. This also reads temperature.

■: I was part of a LSFN elder study, I never heard back from Heidi if there was any follow-up or conclusion. What can you tell me about, can you tell me anything?

- MP: This was a part of the scoping exercise for LSFN and WFN regarding AILA. This is a big part of the project going forward, Heidi, Dean, Nick, and others will be working through this with scoping, with the meeting along with an elder follow-up. I assume that for the next step, this will be shared in the near term, and they are diligently working forward on this. You will be getting this likely in April regarding a pathway forward from this. I can touch base and follow-up if you want, but I'm sure you will hear back soon.


■: Going back to aquatics, the bog which is just below the mouth of the river, if you look just above the peninsula, this is the wild cranberry patch, and this is close to the study. Do you pick up this information or is it monitored automatically? This is not a common occurrence, and it is of importance.

- AM: We will have Rob Foster from Northern Bioscience look at this and examine this for further study, if not already caught by him. Having aquatics here isn't of concern.

Q: Would it be possible to have a discussion with the aquatic consultants?

- AM: For sure, fisheries compensation is on the table for this summer, bringing these experts on board together and providing the opportunity to challenge and ask questions, this can be explored together with the intent to have this discussion in 2024.

■: I had a few questions regarding cyanide, is there a bioaccumulation of cyanide in game fish looking ahead to 2029? Is cyanide picked up by algae? The water temperature still concerns me going forward, along with the outflow PPM. Regarding the monitoring system, will this have an individual model for cyanide going into the water?

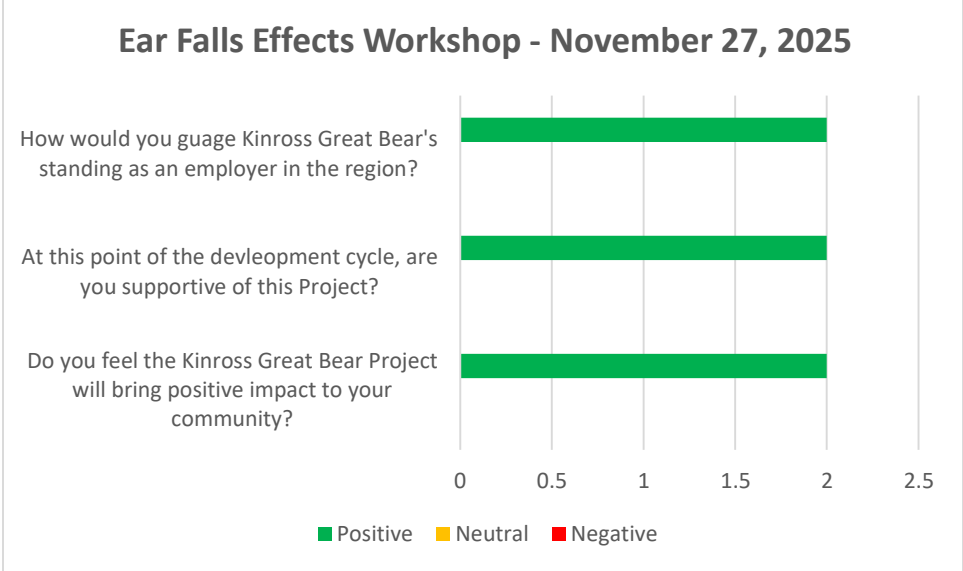

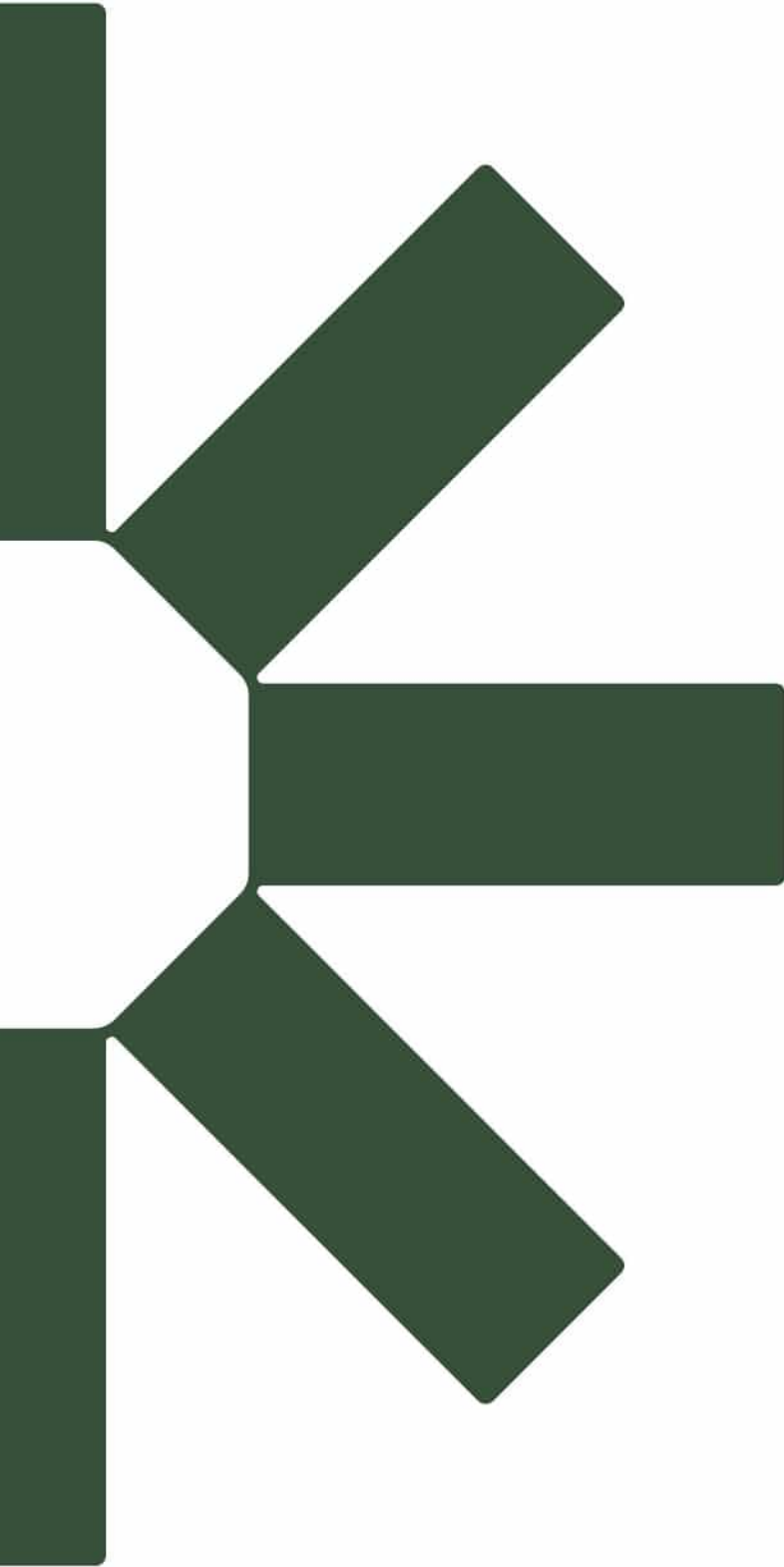
